In Saskatchewan, you will find a great group of men and women in the Towing industry; contributing to community events and local charities, employing and supporting local people and business while providing a very necessary service. The negative portrayal of this industry and its' operators is inaccurate and disturbing. The "wreck chasing" that is depicted on a reality TV program from the Eastern province written about in the article, contributes to an adverse perception that towing is some kind of a wild-west, mobster run industry. Many Saskatchewan companies invest regularly in specialized training opportunities for their drivers with the goal of elevating safety and professionalism in our industry. In Saskatchewan, there exists a professional Provincial towing organization. The Roadside Responders Association of Saskatchewan Inc. has had the support of our Provincial Government regarding safety: for example, the slow to 60 campaigns. We were the first Province in Canada to receive authorization to use distinctive lighting while working. Currently, our industry is working to establish a minimum of standard requirement in order to receive a recognizable tow truck plate that will indicate to the motoring public that the truck has met all the requirements to be in the towing business in our Province.
